

- Some SU costs have increased despite de-registration due to under provision in residential care settings
- Delay in permission to recruit staff has built a 3 to 4 month delay in assessments being started.

- Since April 2014 there have been 4 new Schemes open
- One additional new scheme by the end of 15/16

Forthcoming Developments:

- 6 new Extra Care Housing Schemes to be opened by 2016/17
- Ongoing work will continue to create capacity within Extra Care Housing Schemes for up to 411 DASH clients by 2018/19

Key Issues/Risks

- Lack of progress in embedding Extra Care as alternative in mainstream social work practice is resulting in voids not being filled once vacant
- The Chancellor's budget impact on Housing Associations resulting in potential reluctance to develop additional specialised/Extra Care Housing

Home care improvement project

This project is helping people and providers to use new equipment in order to reduce the number of calls requiring two carers.

- Tender for company to complete assessments was advertised.
- Updates to ELMs were completed.
- Tender to close on 12th and evaluation of tenders to be completed.
- Outcome of tender to be announced
- Contract negotiations to be completed
- Equipment to support care being provided by one carer that is non standard stock will be approved from 8th October
- Training for OT's, Social Workers, Domiciliary
 Care Staff and Informal Carers to be agreed.
